Artona	1	Awarded to a graduating student who has made a significant contribution in the performing arts within Burnsville.
Beverly Barns Memorial Scholarship	1	Awarded to a student that has overcome adversity during their time at Burnsville, and is dedicated to pursuing a post secondary education. Include a <b>400 word essay describing how you have overcome adversity during your time at Burnsville and your education goals.</b>
Burnsville PAC	2	Criteria include; "C+" GPA, involvement in extra curricular activities, volunteer work in the school/community, and financial need. <i>One scholarship for English student and one for French Immersion student.</i> <b>Include a 250 - 300 word essay on What was your best experience at Burnsville? How would you improve that school if you had the chance?</b>
Canadian Federation of University Women-North Delta Bursary	1	Graduating female continuing her education at a post-secondary institution. Minimum "B" average, with demonstrated involvement in school or community activities. Financial need is a requirement. Recipients of major awards are not eligible.
Canadian Parents for French <b>**separate Application due directly to CPF by April 30**</b>	1	A French Immersion student whose family is an active member of the "Canadian Parents for French". There is a written component that is required to be in French due to the grant criteria, however the majority of the application can be in either official language. There is an additional application package required, ask Mrs. Van Geemen for CPF package.
Canteen	1	A graduating student continuing his/her post-secondary education in the culinary arts or business management.
Canuel Caterers	1	Awarded to a student graduating continuing his/her post-secondary education in the culinary arts or business management.
CUPE 1091	1	Awarded to the child or grandchild of a member in good standing of CUPE Local 1091 who is continuing his/her education at a post-secondary institution. Ask Mrs. Van Geemen for their separate application form.
Delta Firefighters Charitable Association	1	Awarded to a student graduating in June and continuing his/her post-secondary education in <b>mechanical or trades</b> fields.
Delta Principals and Vice Principals Association (DPVPA)	1	This award recognizes a deserving, grade 12 student who has post-secondary goals. Selection criteria includes leadership and community involvement.

	Dr Gagan Parmar Health Sciences	1	Write a 250-500 word essay on your interest in health sciences. Include how your career goal, how you became interested in this area and how you have explored this career goal.
	Ecole Devon Gardens	1	Must have attended Ecole Devon Gardens, and be graduating from the French Immersion program. Must further his/her education and has contributed to the culture and the life of his/her school in an exemplary way. Minimum "B " average.
	Fraser Valley Realtors Charitable Foundation (FVRCF)	1	A Canadian citizen or have PR status, graduating from DSD with plans to attend an accredited Canadian university, college or technical/ trades school in the Fall. Can be used, not only for tuition, but for other related expenses as well.
	Glacier	1	Awarded to a graduating student who has made a significant STEM contribution at Burnsvew.
	Ken Sotvedt Memorial Scholarship * Due May 3 for the District.	1	Must be a graduating student intending on pursuing a career in music, and possesses strong musical ability and interest. Mr. Kan ( band teacher) is able to nominate 1 student for district committee selection. Include a 250-300 letter on your future career plans in music and any/all community service you have done.
	Laura Szendrei	1	Available to any graduating student at Burnsvew that is enrolled in post-secondary studies for the Fall. Criteria include; a well rounded student who is involved in sports, has demonstrated volunteerism or community service. Preference given to student with financial need.

	TeejLab Technology Fellowship	2	A graduating student continuing their education in Fall. Preference will be given to females or visible minorities entering the field of technology or cybersecurity and have a financial need. Application to include a 300-350 word paragraph on one of the following topics: "Why is there a need for diversity in technical roles?" or "How do youth learn about cyber security?" Burnsvew scholarship committee will select 2 -3 school nominees and TeejLab will select the winner. We support all educational goals and aspirations including those of Indigenous people, visible minorities, diversely abled people, women, and people from the LGBTQ2S+ communities.
